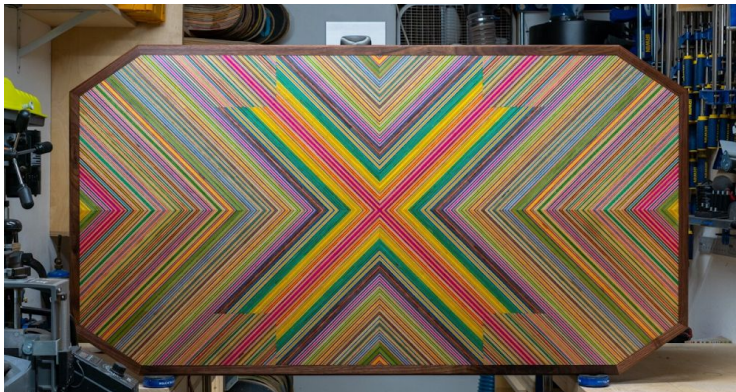


## Ben Paik
